#### Ordering

- Now we are used to ordering online, please try and follow the options above to make sure 3 courses are not being ordered for the children use the not required button in order to get the form submitted. Where the choices have been made for 3 courses and the children are only entitled to 2, we normally offer the children the pudding option rather than the soup.
