Thank you very much for ordering the school meals so promptly – it makes it much easier for us to keep the kitchens up to speed.


#### World Book Day

World Book Day is on Thursday 2 March this year. We are planning a competition for all the children themed around characters and scenes from books.

### EARLY LEARNING AND CHILDCARE REGISTRATION 2023/24

Registration opens Friday 17 February at 9am until Friday 24 February at 5pm.

**If your child turns three years old** between 1 March 2023 and 29 February 2024, they become eligible for their first year of funded Early Learning and Childcare place the term after their third birthday as below:

Children born between	Eligible to start	
1 March 2020 – 31 August 2020	22 August 2023	(the Autumn Term)
1 September 2020 - 31 December 2020	8 January 2024	(the Spring Term)
1 January 2021 - 28 February 2021	15 April 2024	(the Summer Term)

You need to complete the online registration form during registration week accessed in Education/Learning from the OIC website <u>www.orkney.gov.uk</u>. where information on all local settings and childminders in partnership will also be available. Online registration forms can be accepted after this deadline but please be aware that in some settings, spaces may be oversubscribed.

In the Papdale catchment area there are two settings, Papdale and the Strynd. Glaitness is also available to Papdale catchment parents. When registering, parents will be asked to indicate their first choice, followed by their second and third in the event that their first choice is oversubscribed at the time of registering. Once registration opens, places are allocated in the order they are received.

**If your child is three or four years old** and is currently attending their first year of Early Learning and Childcare they will automatically be carried forward for their second year of Early Learning and Childcare in their current setting. They do not need to complete a registration form <u>unless</u> they are requesting to change setting for their second year in the Papdale catchment area. A Change of Setting form should be submitted during registration week accessed in Education/Learning from the OIC website <u>www.orkney.gov.uk</u>.

**Children aged two years old** may be eligible for a place the term after their second birthday if parents/carers are in receipt of certain benefits or care experienced (born between the 1 March 2021 and 28 February 2022). Registration for a two year old place is continually open, an application form can be completed by accessing Education/Learning from the OIC website <u>www.orkney.gov.uk</u>. Forms should be completed no earlier than three months prior to the date of the child's second birthday.

#### **PRIMARY ONE REGISTRATION 2023/24**

#### Registration opens Friday 17 February at 9am until Friday 24 February at 5pm.

If your child is five years old on or between 1 March and the first day of school term, Tuesday 22 August 2023, your child will start school this August.

If your child is five years old on or between Wednesday 23 August and the last day of February 2024, your child can start school on 22 August 2023. However, you have the option to defer your child's entry to school.

From August 2023, a change in legislation means that all children who are eligible to defer as above, will automatically be able to access an additional year of funded Early Learning and Childcare.

Parents and guardians who wish to enrol their child(ren) for Primary One are required to complete the online registration form during registration week. P1 Registration forms can be accessed under 'Schools' in Education/Learning from the OIC website <u>www.orkney.gov.uk</u>. where information on starting primary one will also be available. Online registration forms can be accepted after this deadline.

If you choose to defer your child, please confirm this with your Early Learning and Childcare setting and your child will automatically be carried forward for an additional year. You will not therefore be required to complete a registration form for Primary One.
