Staffing Updates

Ingrid Nicolson has joined us in the Nursery on a part time basis to cover for Pat's afternoon sessions which remain vacant. Ingrid is enjoying her time with us here at Orphir and has settled well and will continue to cover until the vacancy is filled.

As you may or may not be aware Moira is retiring in June. Moira has taught many children over her 16 years here at Orphir and will be greatly missed. Moira is looking forward to spending more time with her three grandchildren and we will miss her dearly. We plan to have some type of send off to Moira in the final term and the parent council or a representative of would be more than welcome.

At advert has gone out for a full-time, permanent Early Years Lead Practitioner to start in the Nursery in August so we are hopeful that this will attract a range of curious and suitable candidates to help cover Moira and Pat's sessions.

Megan has another year left of her contract as Early Years Practitioner so it will be good for the children to have some continuity in the Nursery whilst the new staff member(s) settle.

Rachel bunnett starts working in the PI-3 class on the 17th April. Rachel is a PGDE student at the University of the Highlands & Islands and joins us for her final primary education placement. Rachel is currently completing a placement in Stenness (P5-7) and will fit in perfectly here.

Child Protection Policy

Christine Tulloch (Acting Principal Teacher - Flotta) has been working hard to develop a school Child Protection policy that is bespoke to our school. This policy takes into account what law, national and local policy dictates to us in term of child protection and keeping our children as safe as possible and explains clearly our systems and processes. Staff are currently in the consultation process of draft 1 and we would then like to take it to consultation with the parent council before sharing with the wider parent body. We hope to do this either before, or at the next meeting in preparation for a final version being ready to launch in August.

P7 Residential

This year takes place at Hoy Outdoor Centre from the 9th to 12th May. Our PTS will be joining up with Stenness, Westray, Papa Westray and Sanday. The cost of the trip works out at €250 max per pupil and huge thanks go to the P7 parent group who clubbed

together and have already started planning for the bingo fundraiser to help reduce costs as much as possible. Opening up the fundraising to the solo P7 pupil at Stenness was an incredibly kind gesture and was well received. Once the experience has been completed we will need to arrive at some decision as to whether or not we continue with that model or revert to the traditional model of travelling further south.
